

Overview of the year:			Ways to consolidate and extend your learning in Geography:	
<p>This year, students begin by recapping on the topic of Coasts and revise coastal processes and how they create different landforms. Students then in before moving onto managing coastlines to prevent erosion and seeing how this impacts people’s lives in a case study set in Folkestone. At the end of this half-term, students will complete PPE exams in all GCSE content covered so far. In half term 2, students will work through the topic of Changing Economic World, which looks at how different countries are developing at different rates and how different strategies can help increase the wealth of a country. Students will then investigate the economies of Nigeria and the UK and see how they have changed over time. In the last 3 half terms, students will be revising for their upcoming GCSE geography exams.
